Methodology

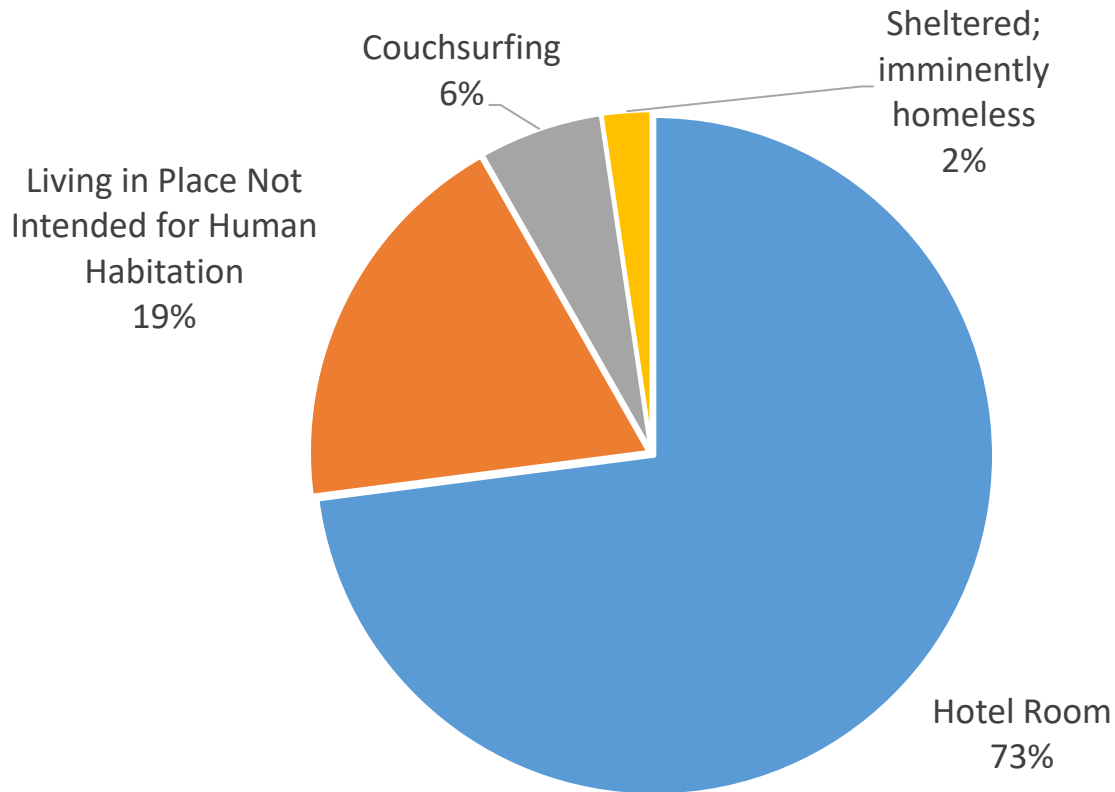
- Community partners were asked to collect information on all homeless individuals that they interacted with on January 25, 2023.

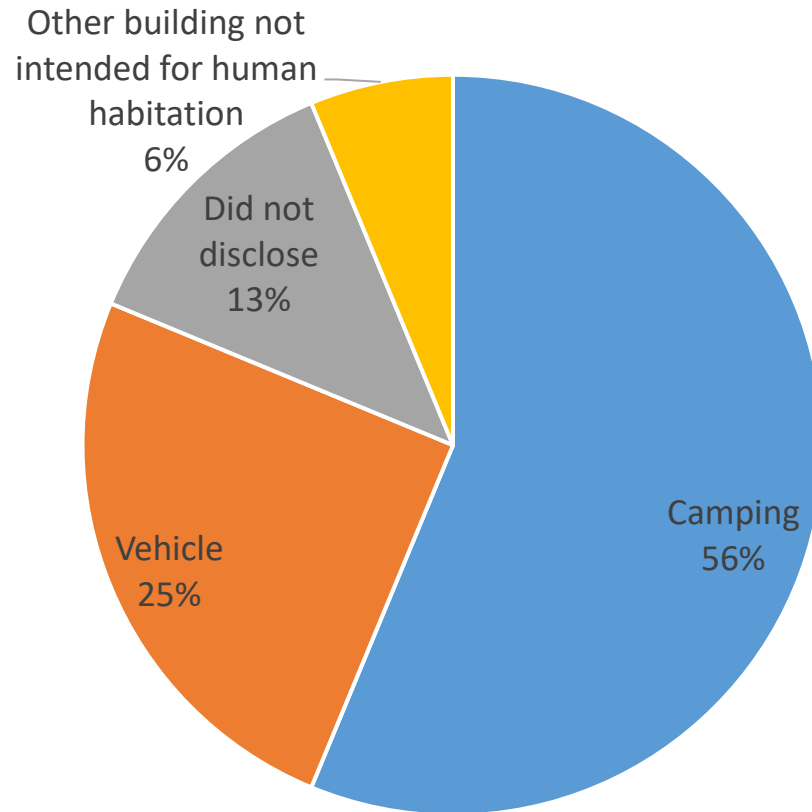

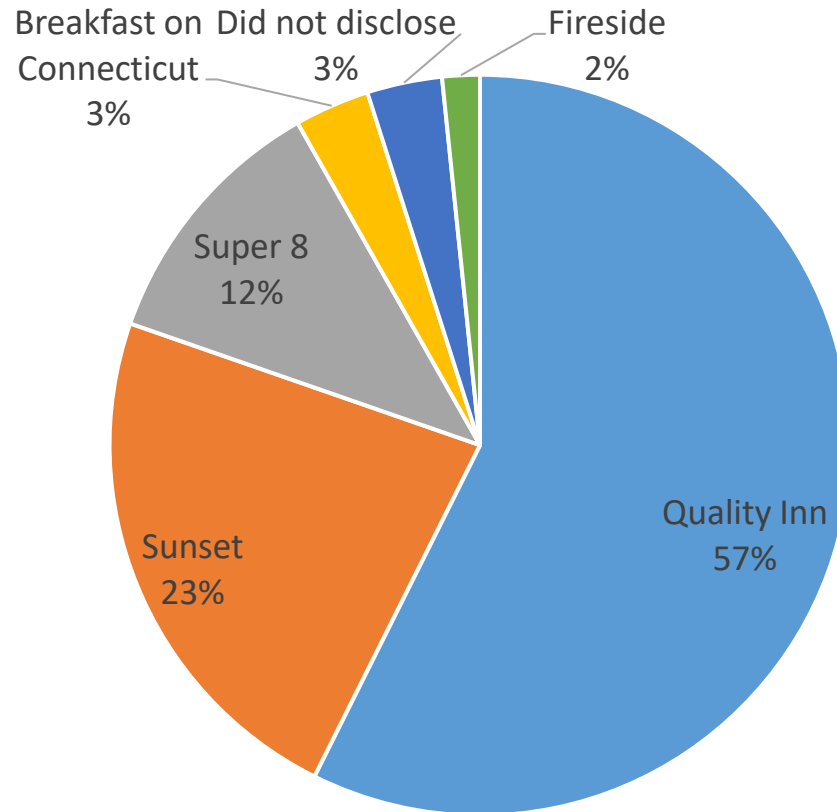
Where Did You Stay Last Night?



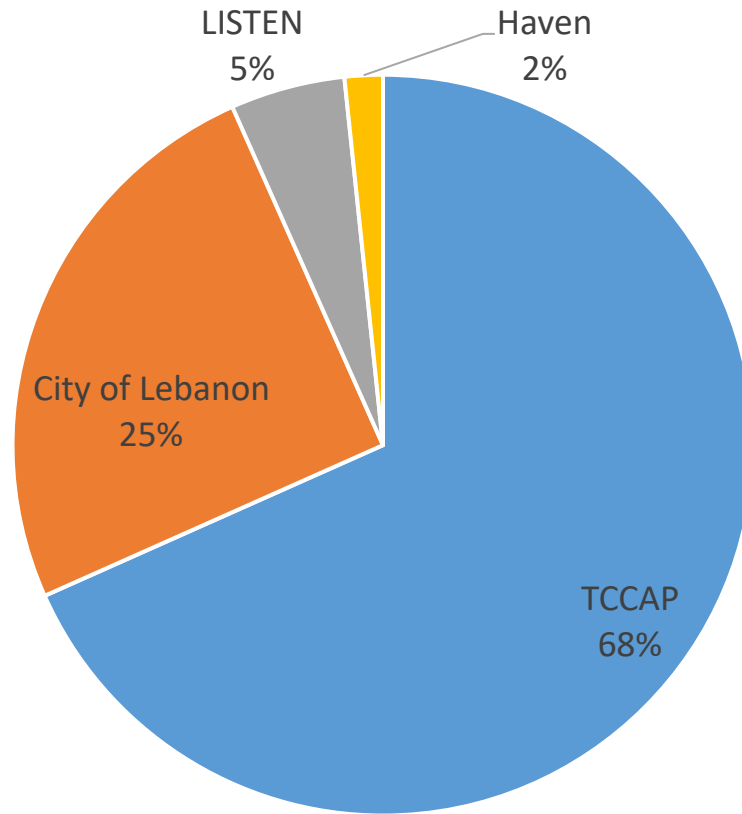
Where Did You Stay Last Night? (Unsheltered)



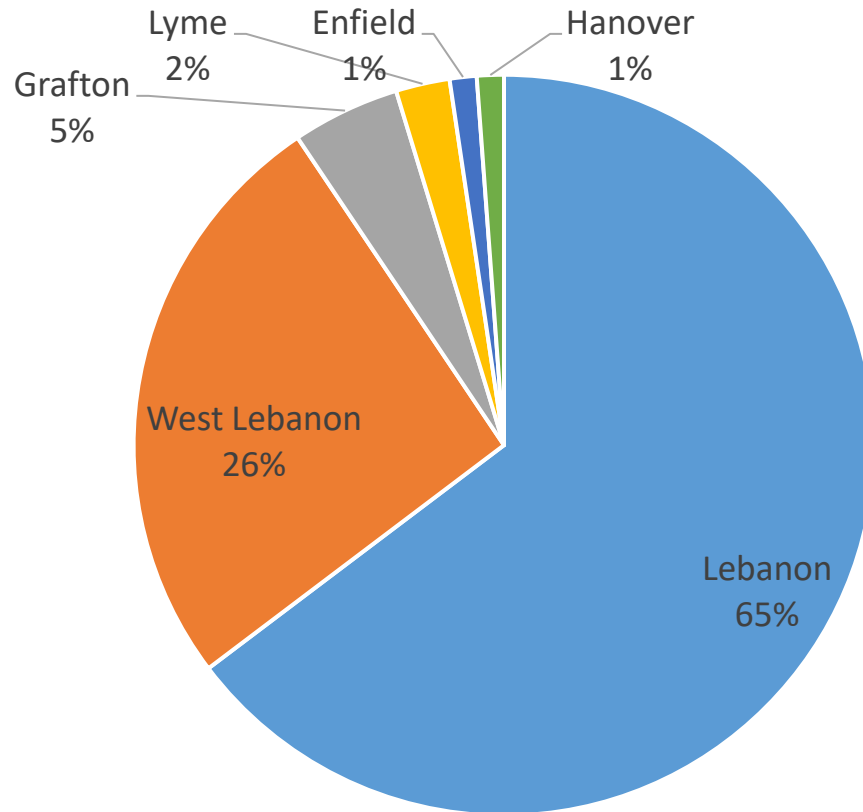
Where Did You Stay Last Night? (Sheltered, Hotel guests)



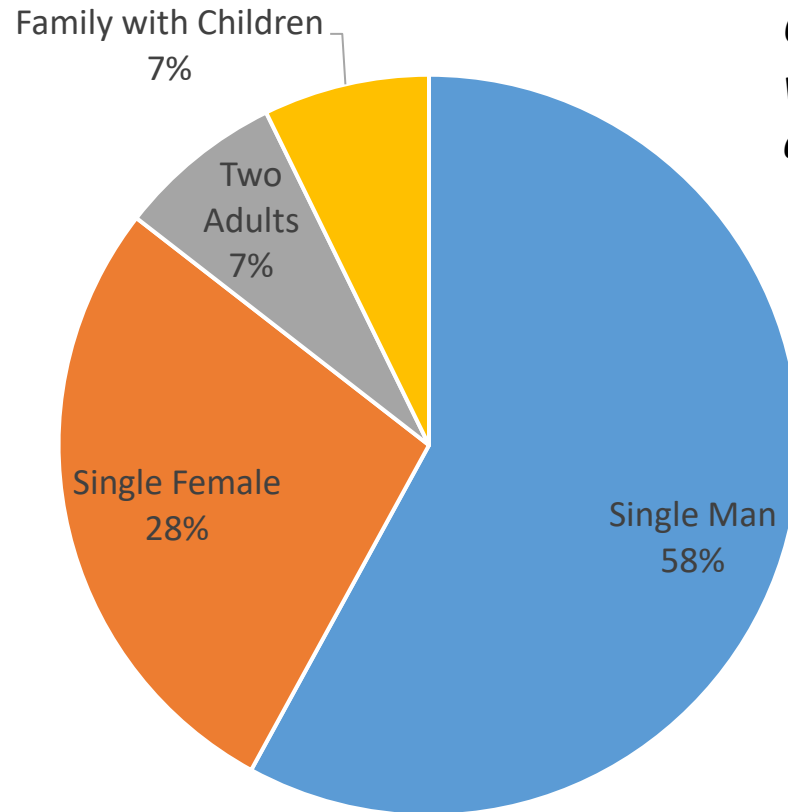
Who Paid for Your Hotel Stay? (Sheltered, Hotel Guests)



What Town Are You From?

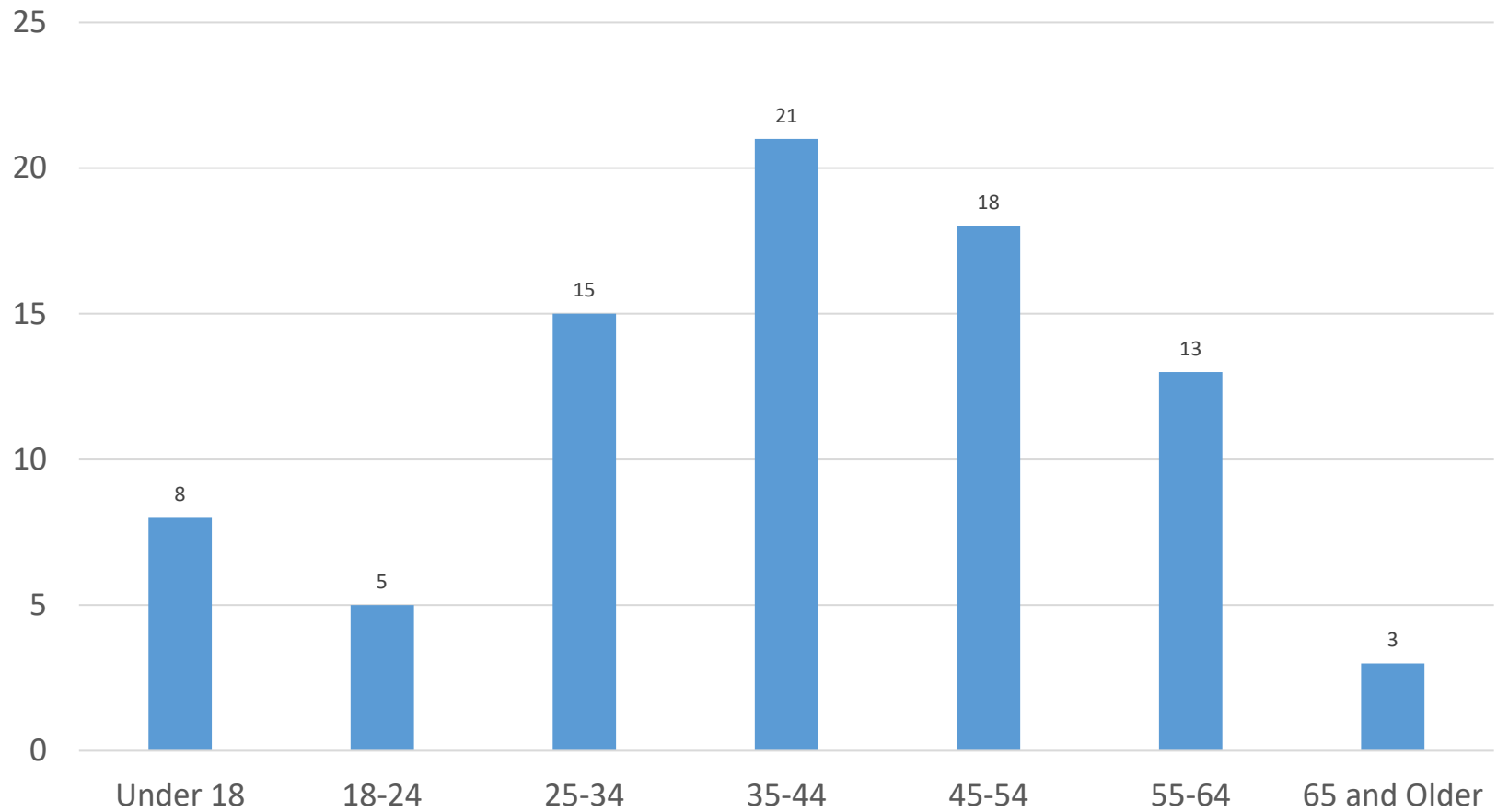

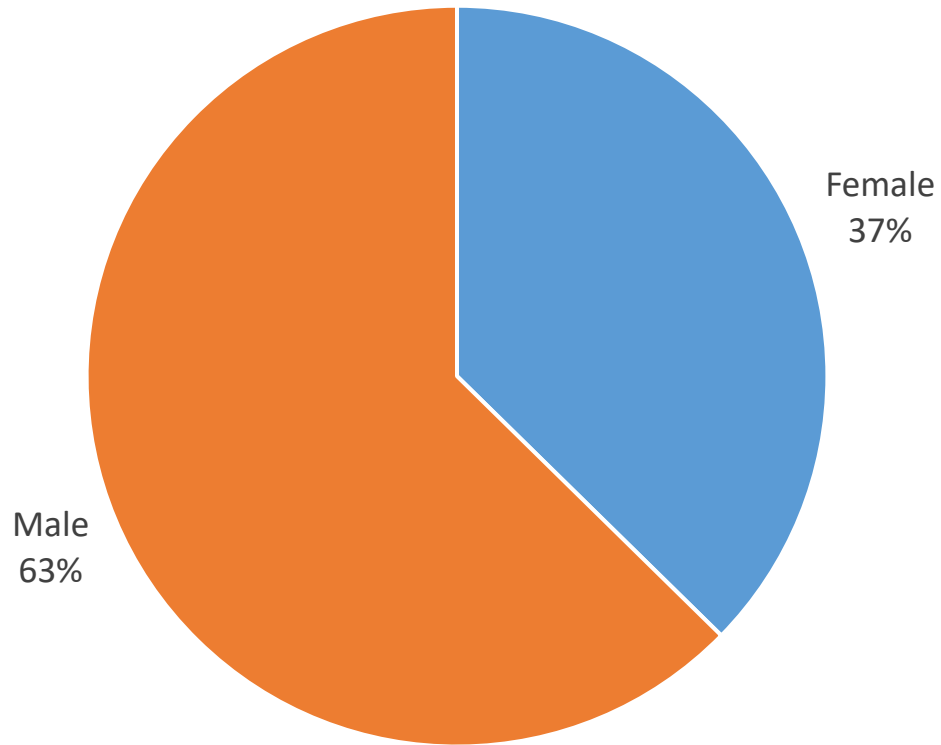


One family with children was unsheltered and camping.

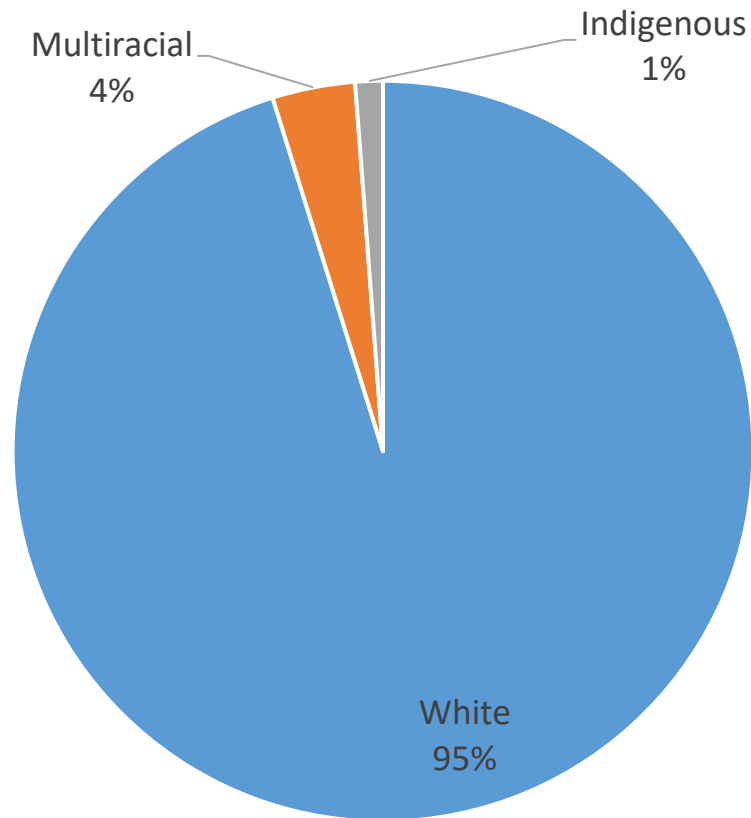

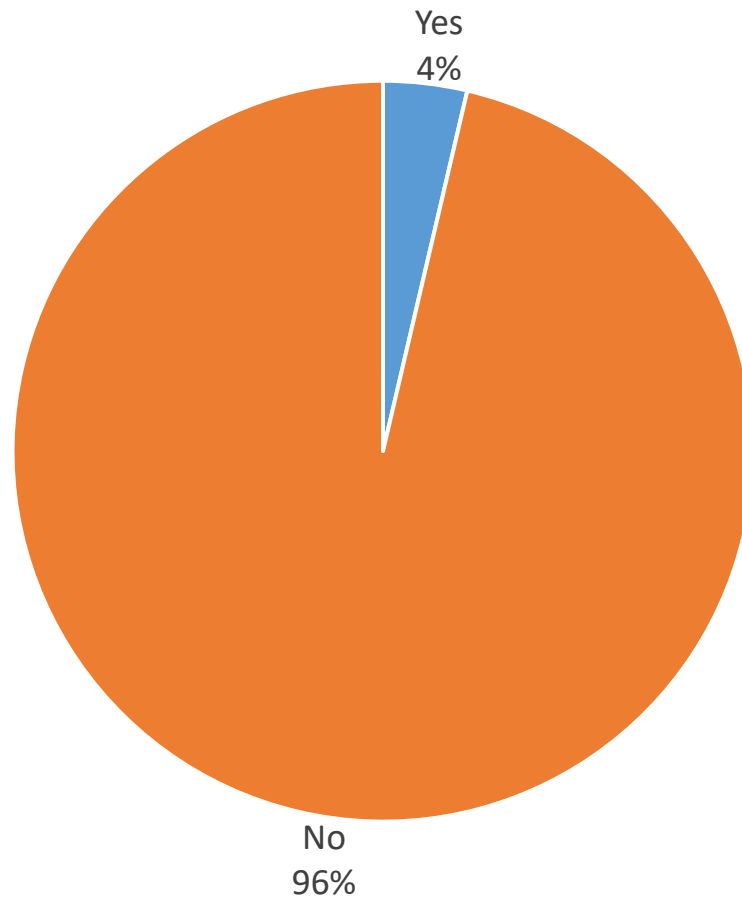


The survey included options for trans women, trans men, and gender non-conforming, but 0% of individuals identified as such.

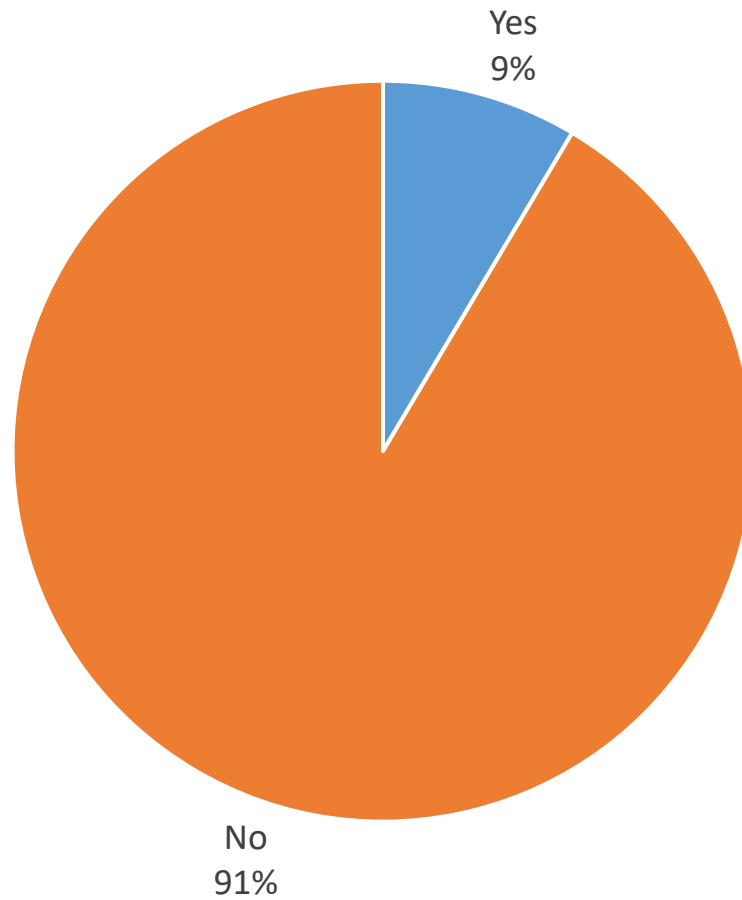

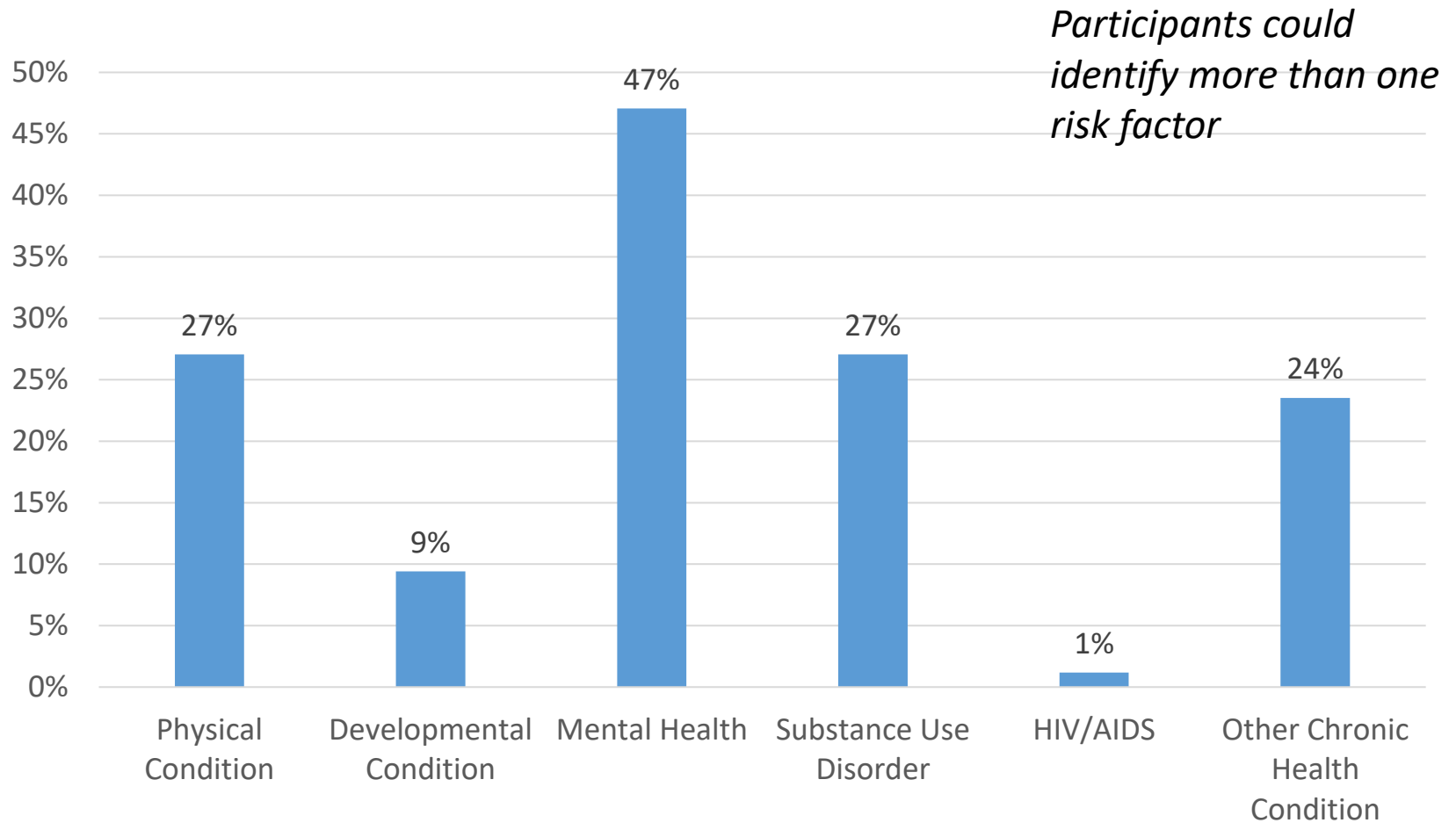

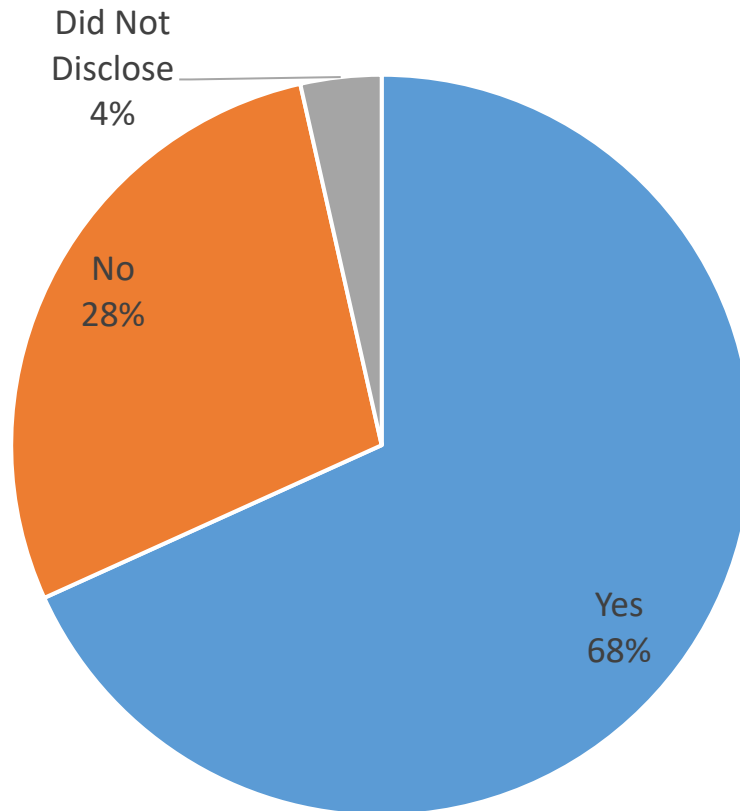
Currently Fleeing Domestic Violence

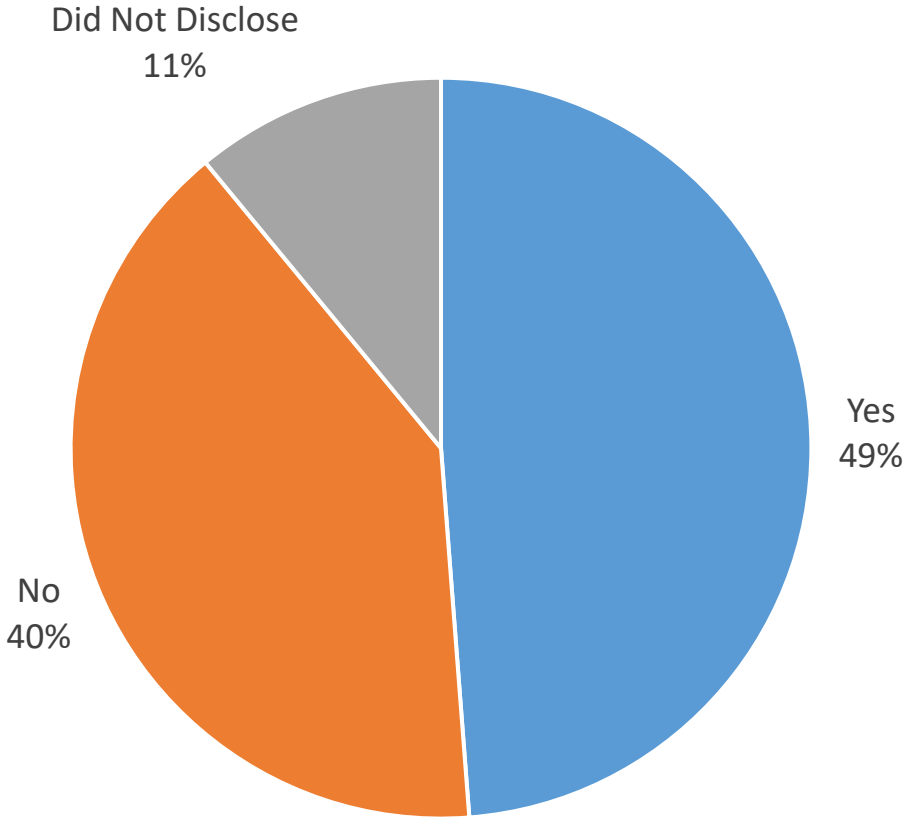
Disabling Condition



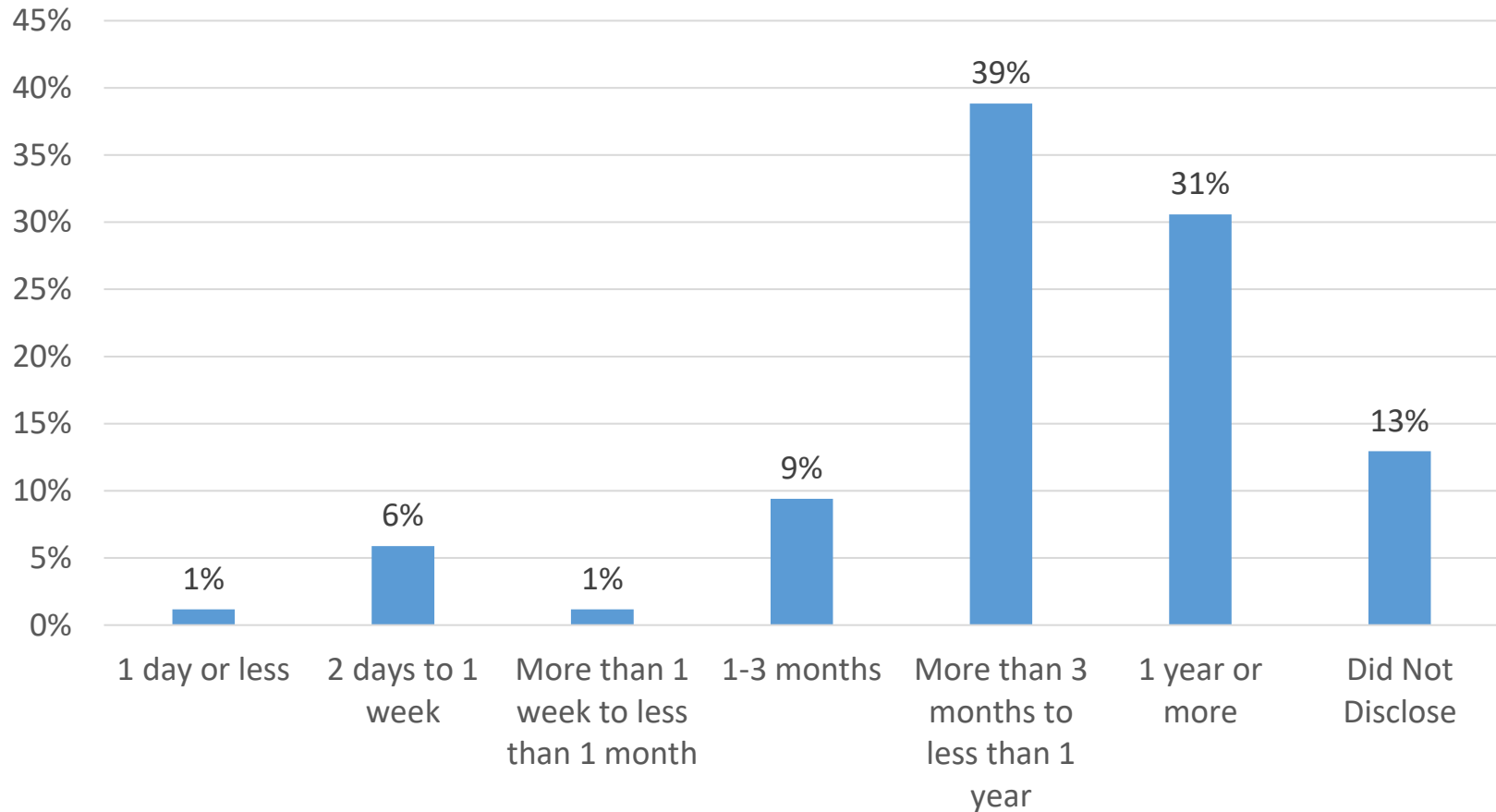
Participants are considered to have a disabling condition if they identified one or more of the following conditions:

- *Other Chronic Health Condition*

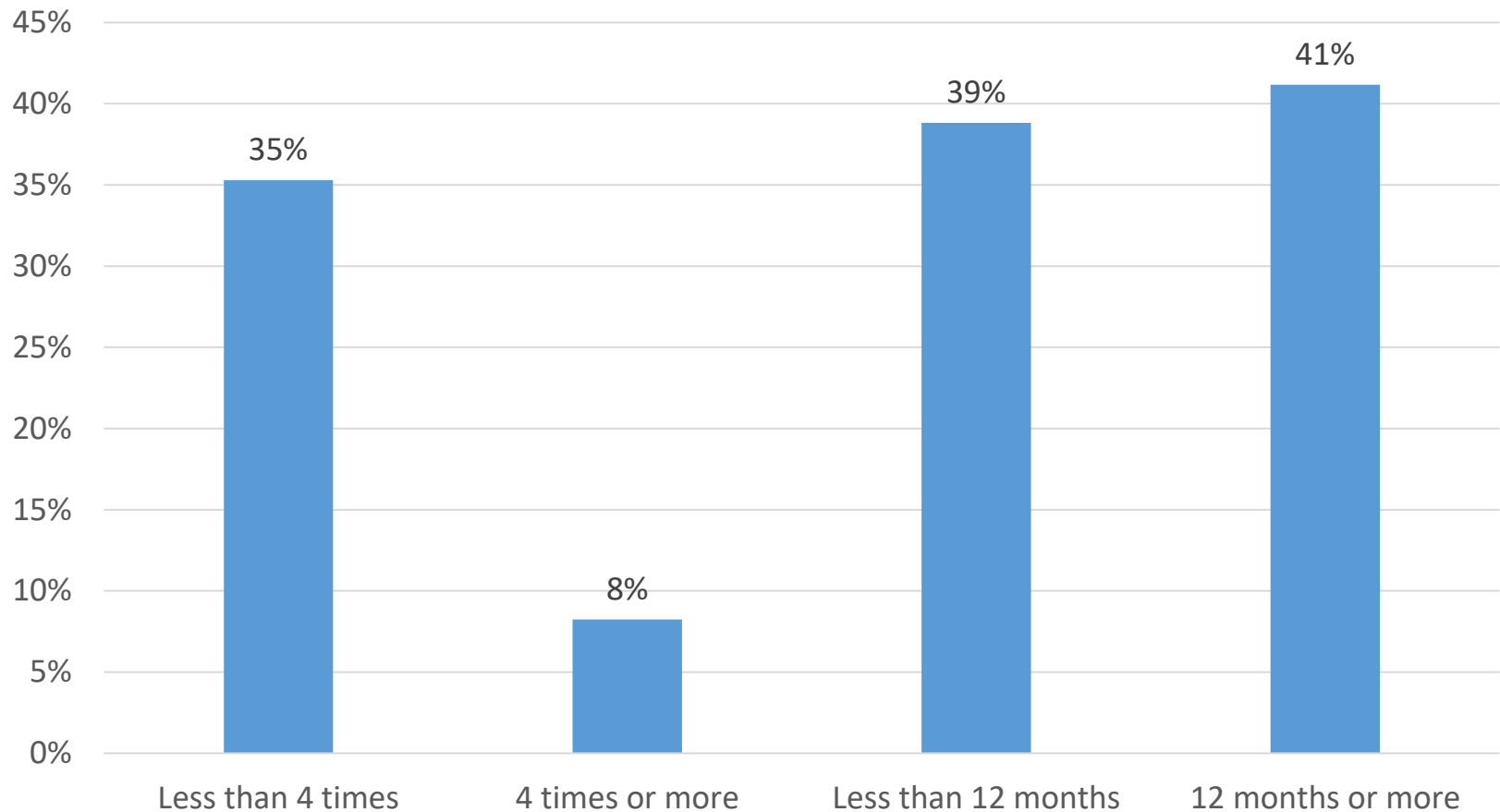
First Time Homeless



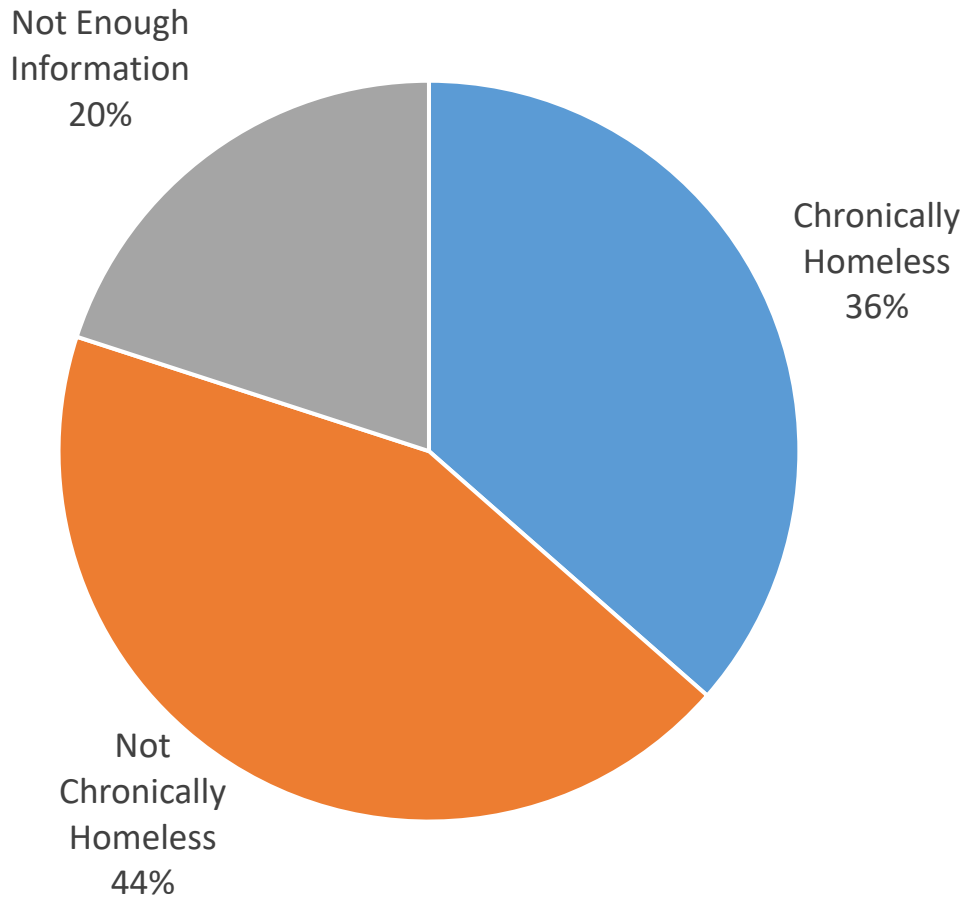
How long have you been homeless this time?
