# Methodology

- Community partners were asked to collect information on all homeless individuals that they interacted with on January 24-25, asking where they spent the night on January 24.
- LISTEN and the City of Lebanon Human Services were the lead agencies for conducting the PIT Count for Lower Grafton County.
- Approximately 25 volunteers assisted with conducting street outreach to over 40 known locations for homeless encampments or homeless services.

# Additional Notes

- The Lebanon Emergency Shelter opened its doors for the first time on January 25, the day **AFTER** our Point-in-Time count.
- Collaborated with WISE during this PIT Count and also includes their data for the first time – hence the rise in # of individuals fleeing domestic violence

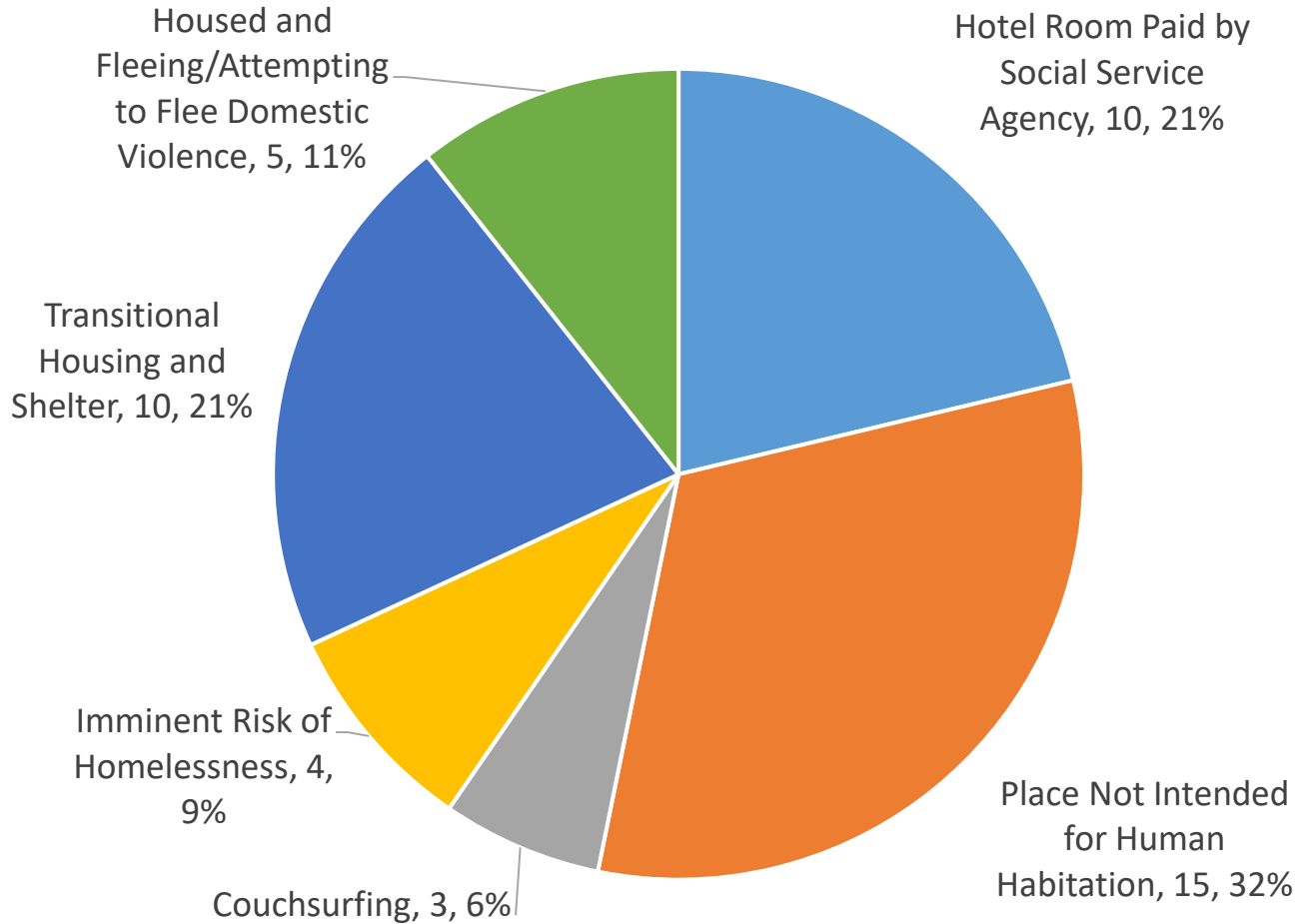

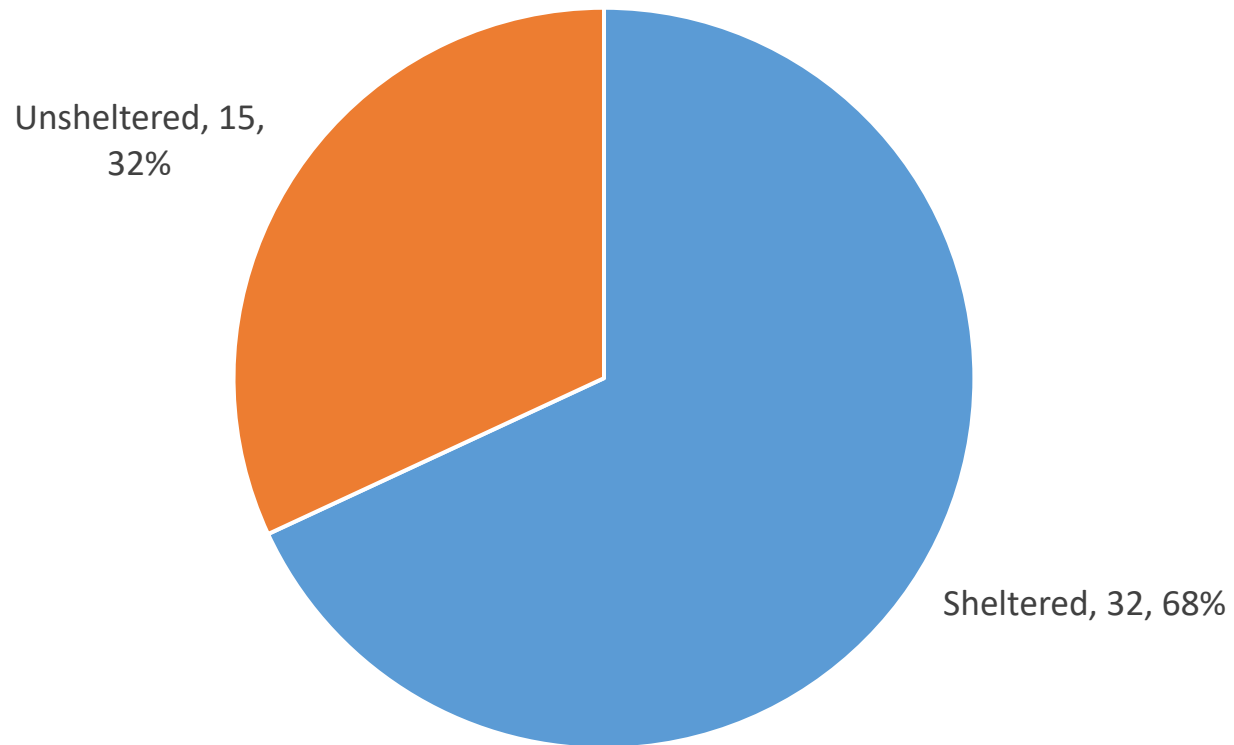

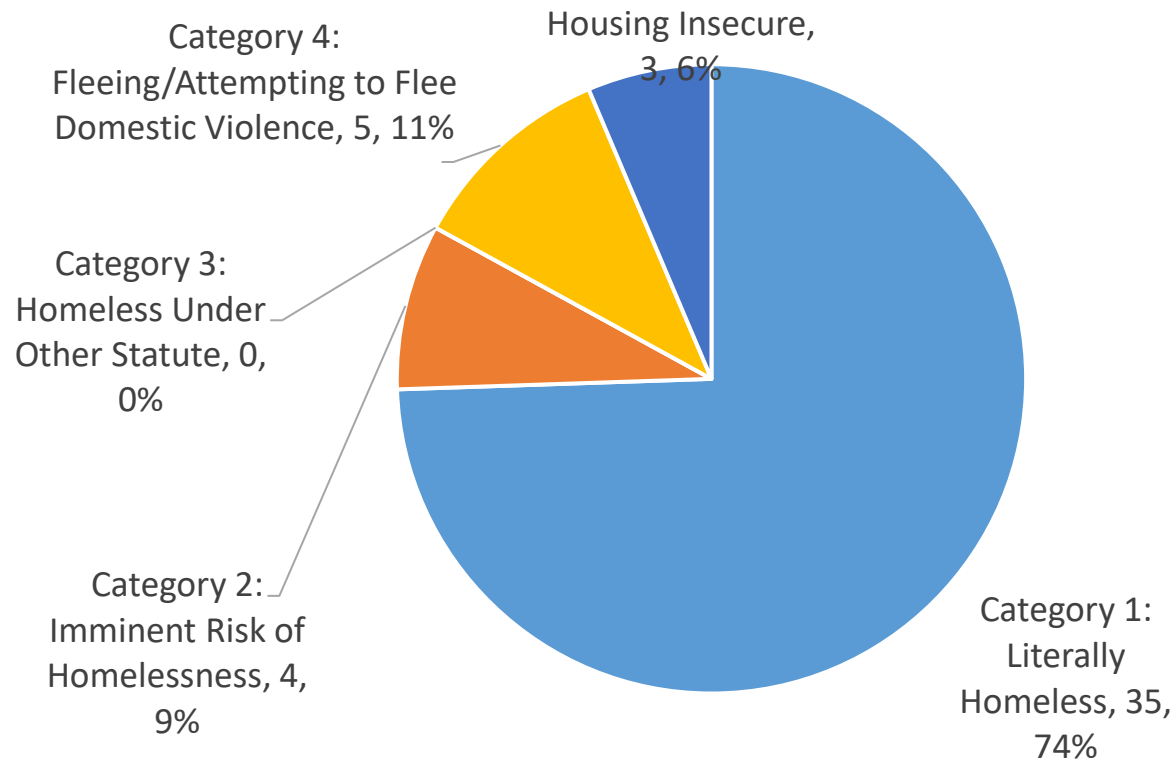

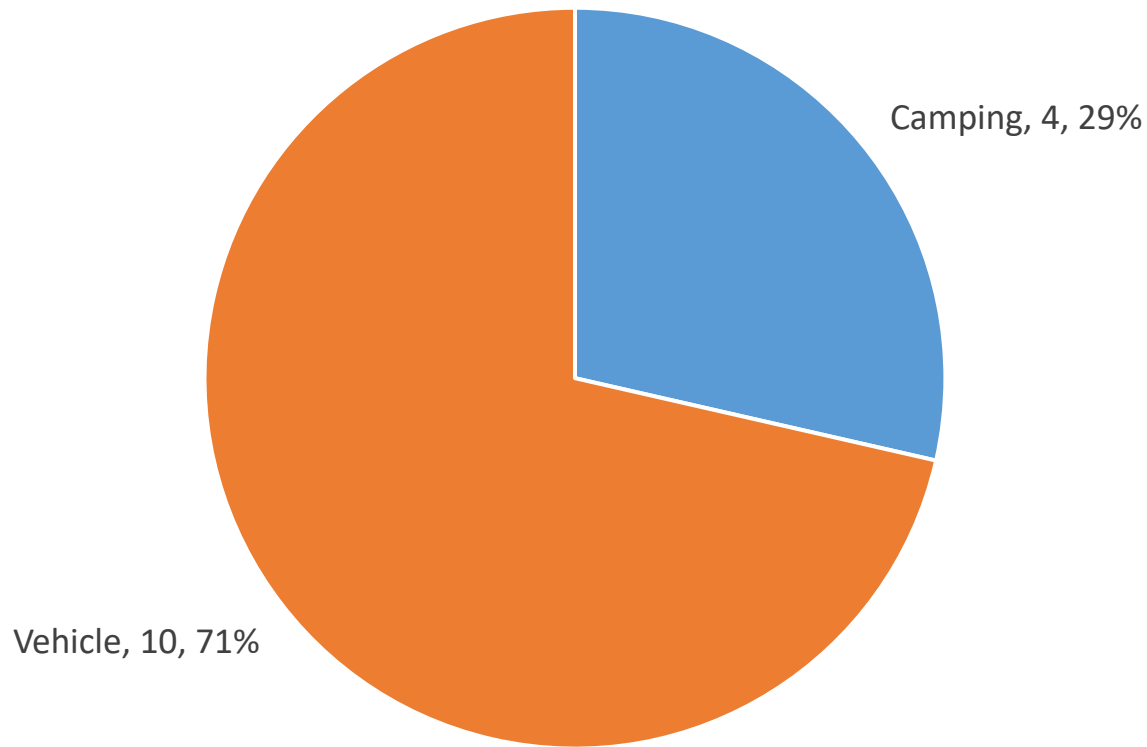


# HUD Definitions of Homelessness



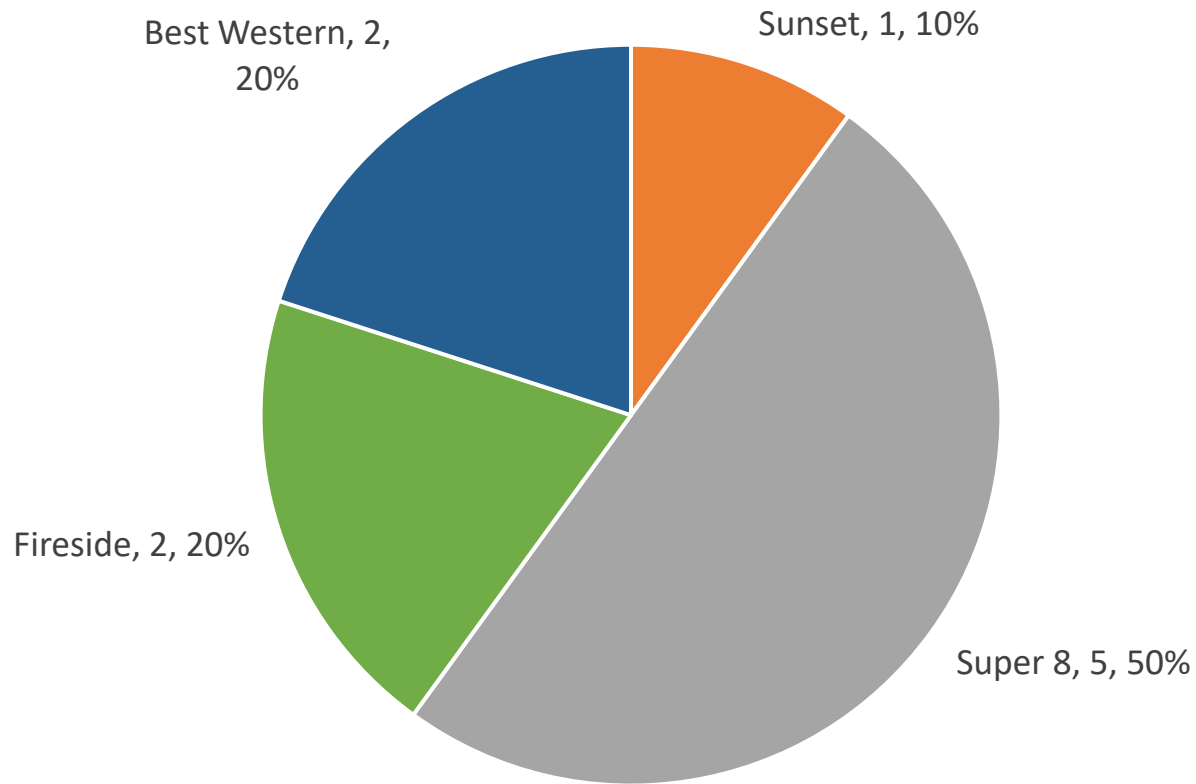

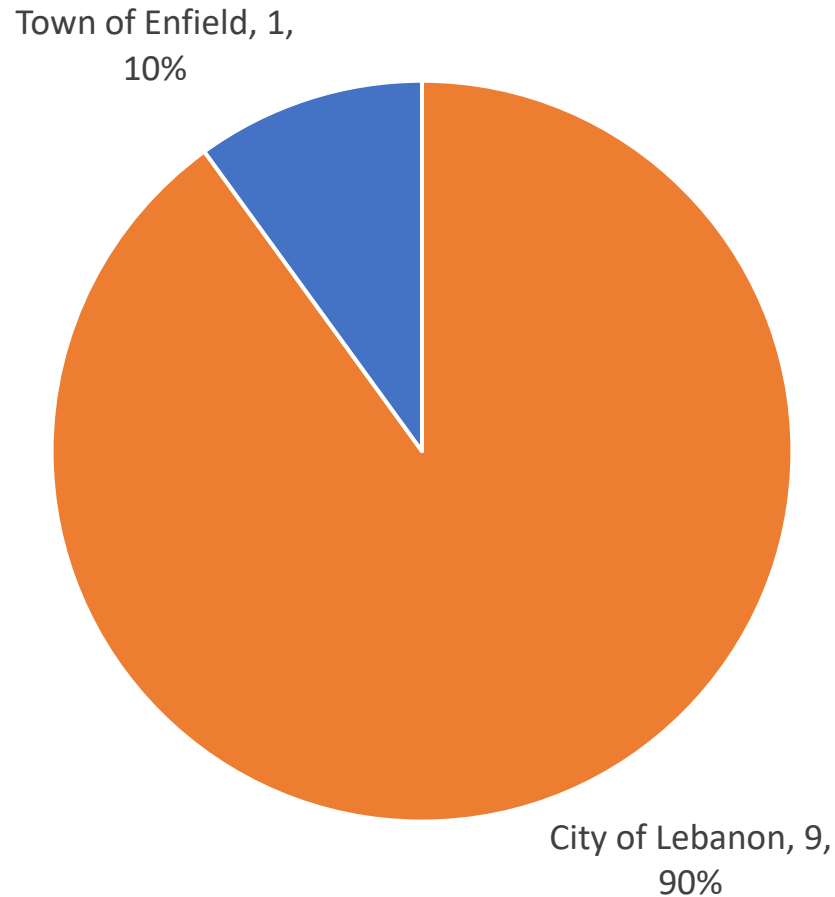




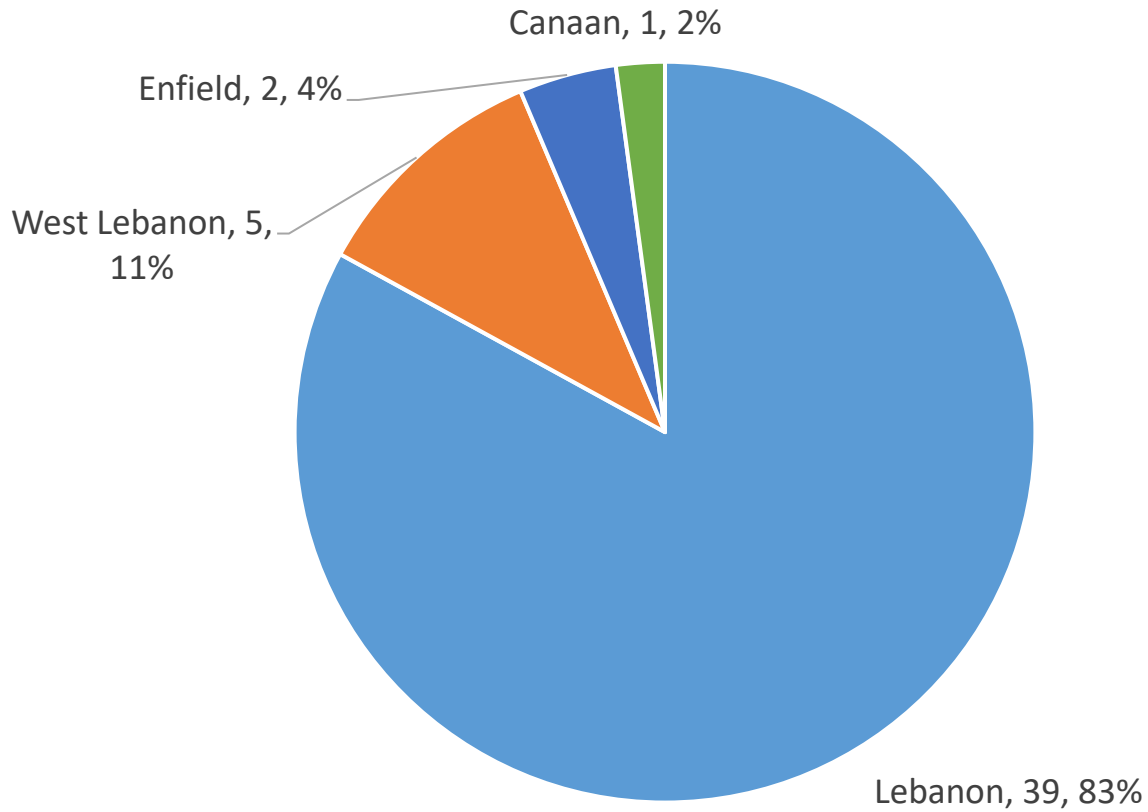
# Where Did You Stay Last Night? (Sheltered, Hotel guests)



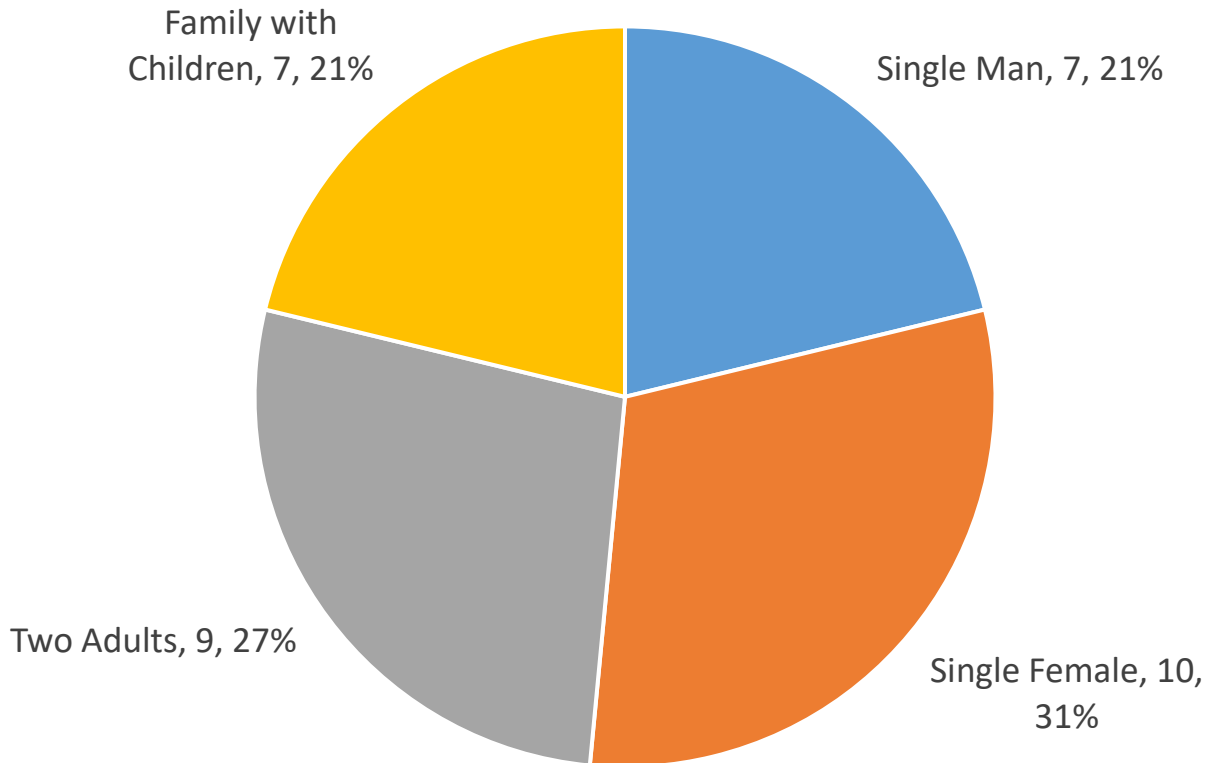
# Who Paid for Your Hotel Stay? (Sheltered, Hotel Guests)



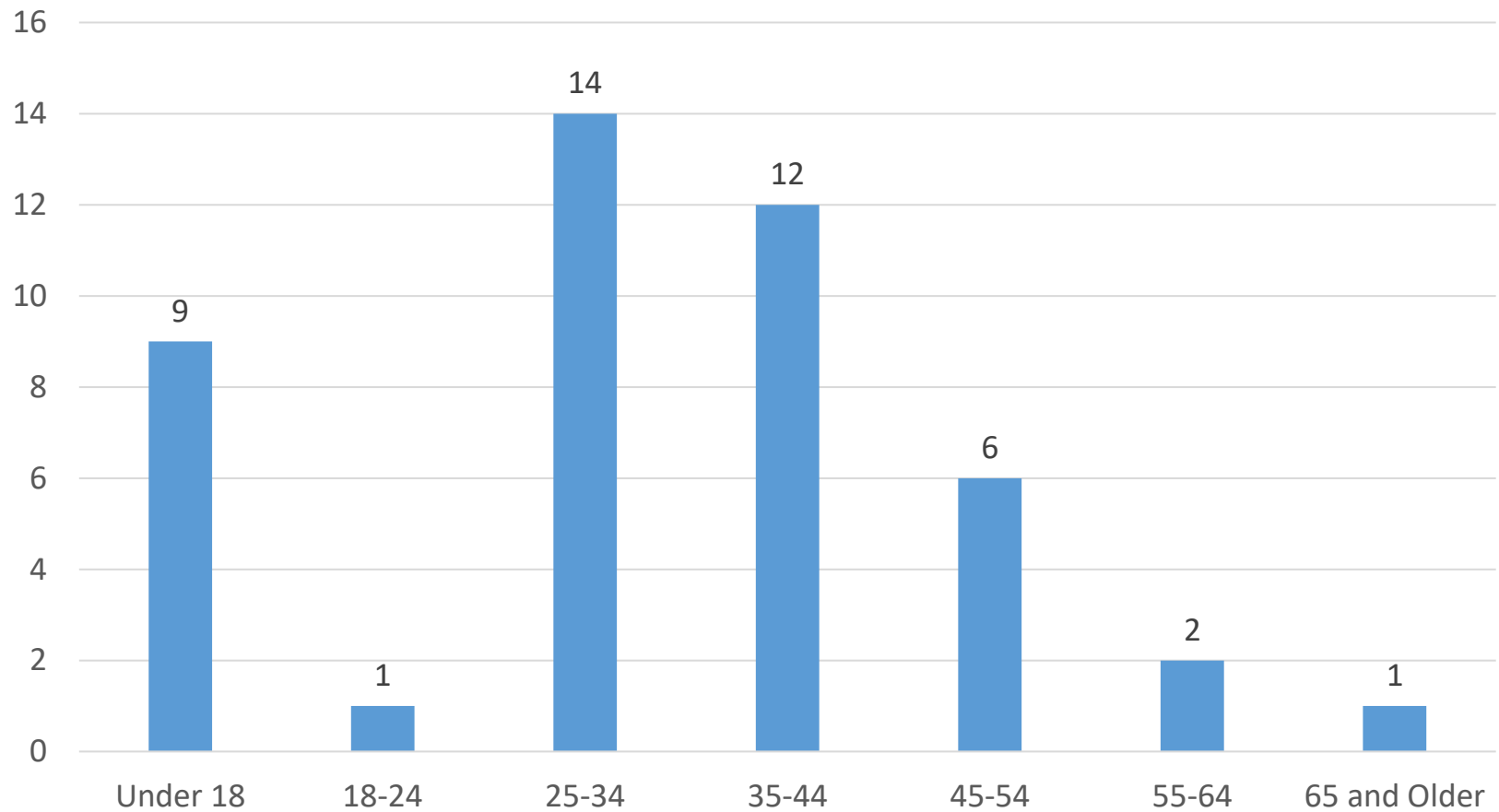

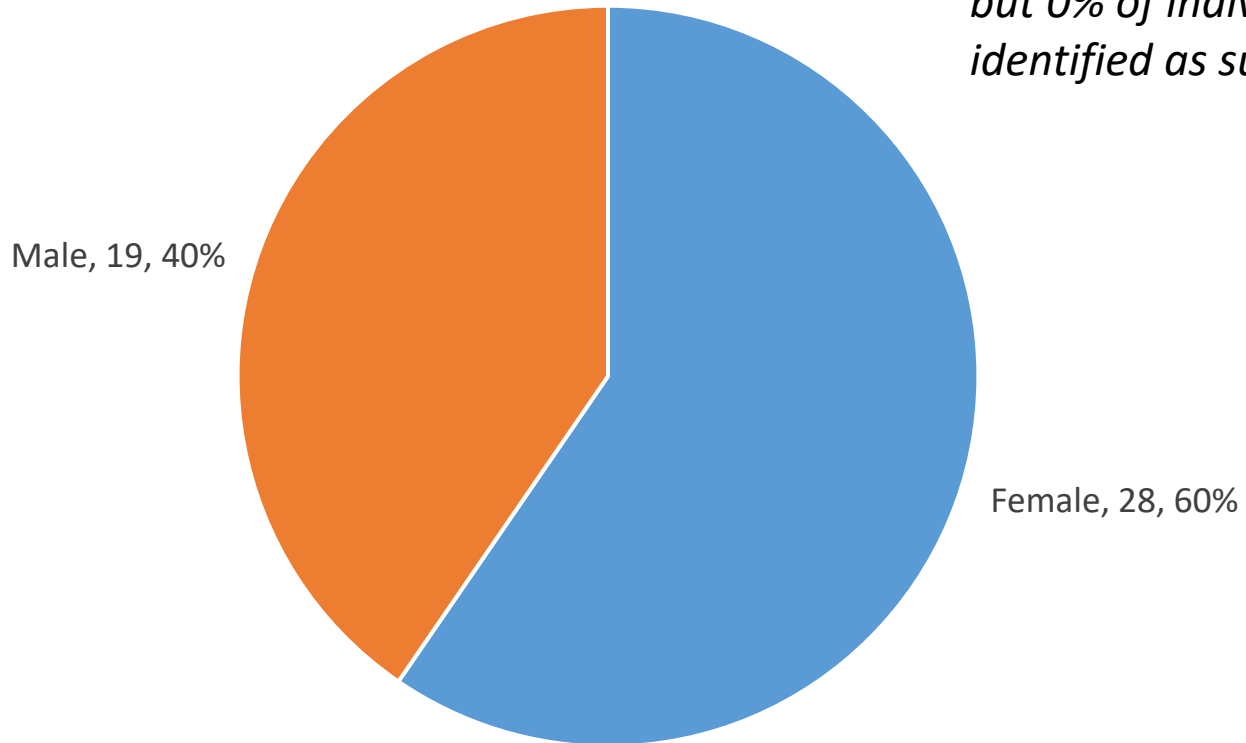

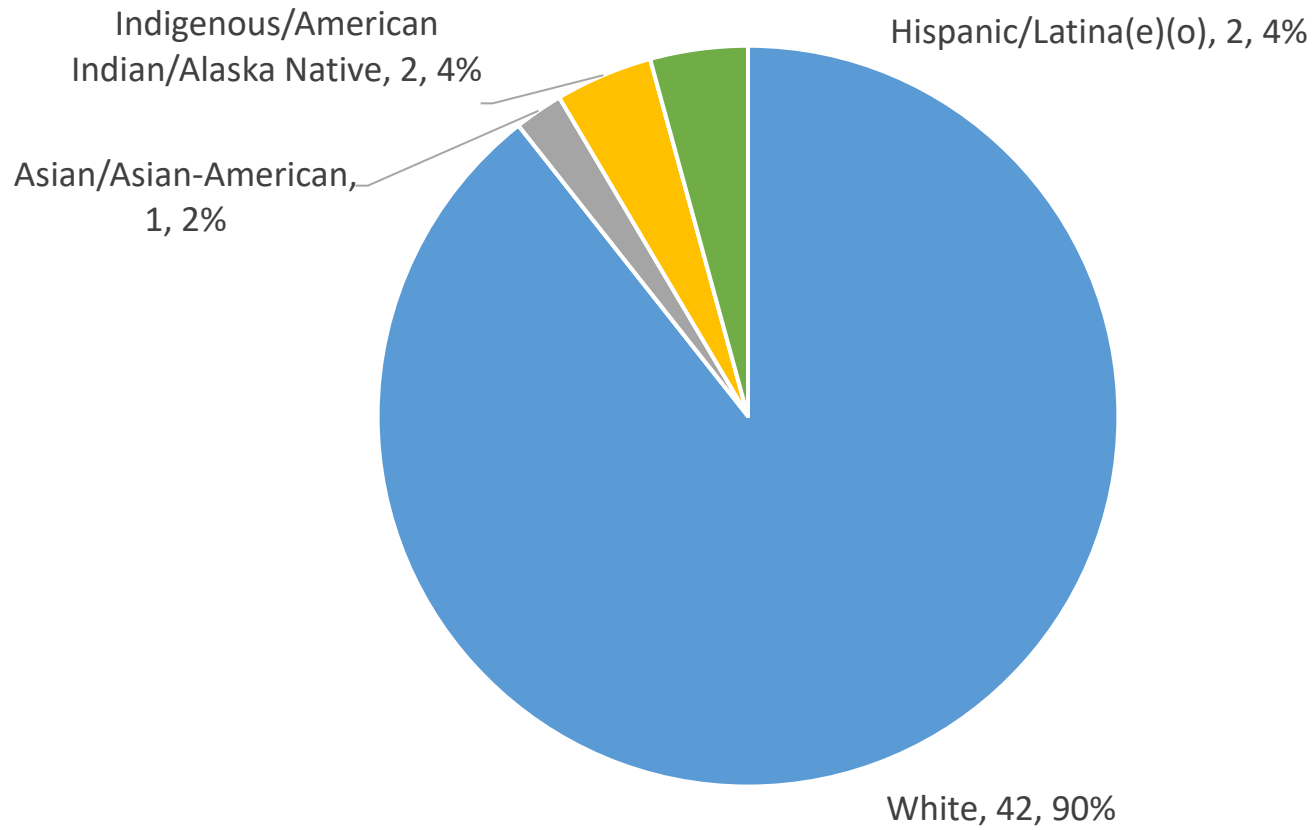

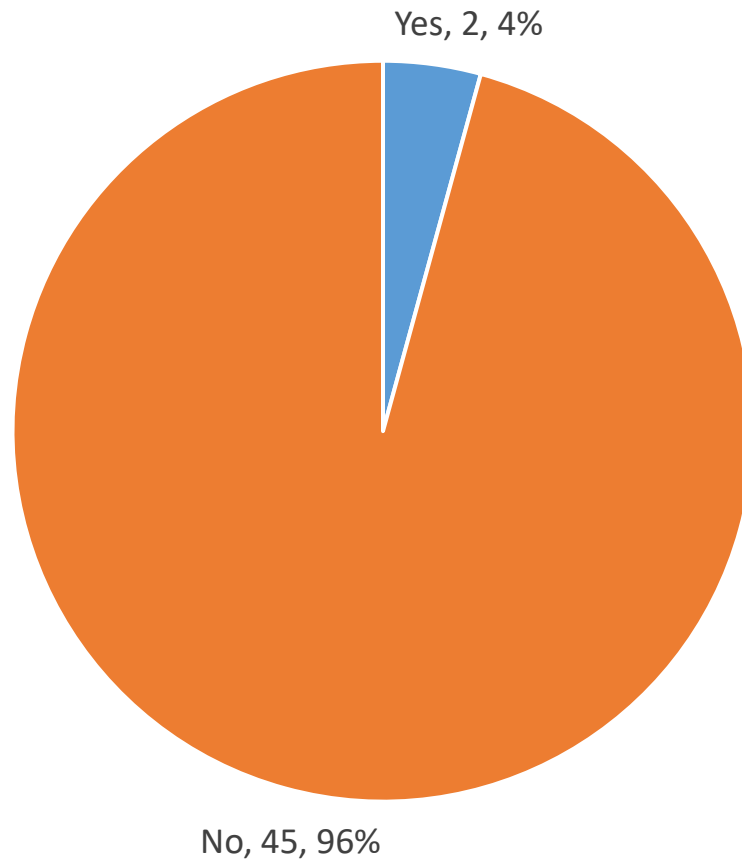
*The survey included options for trans women, trans men, and gender non-conforming, but 0% of individuals identified as such.*

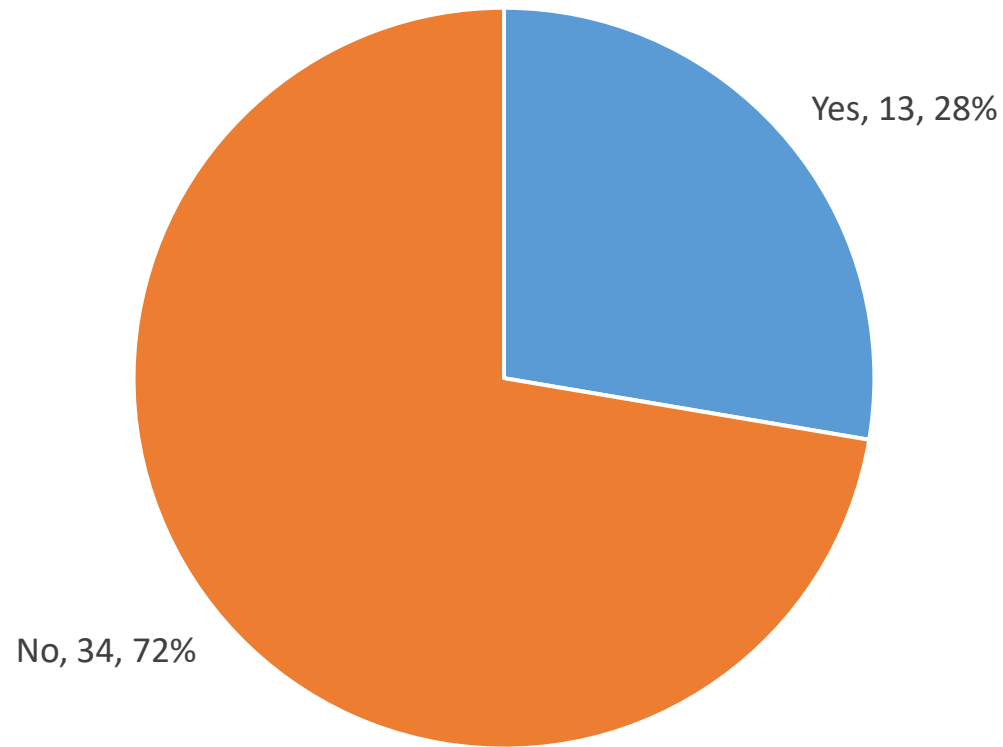

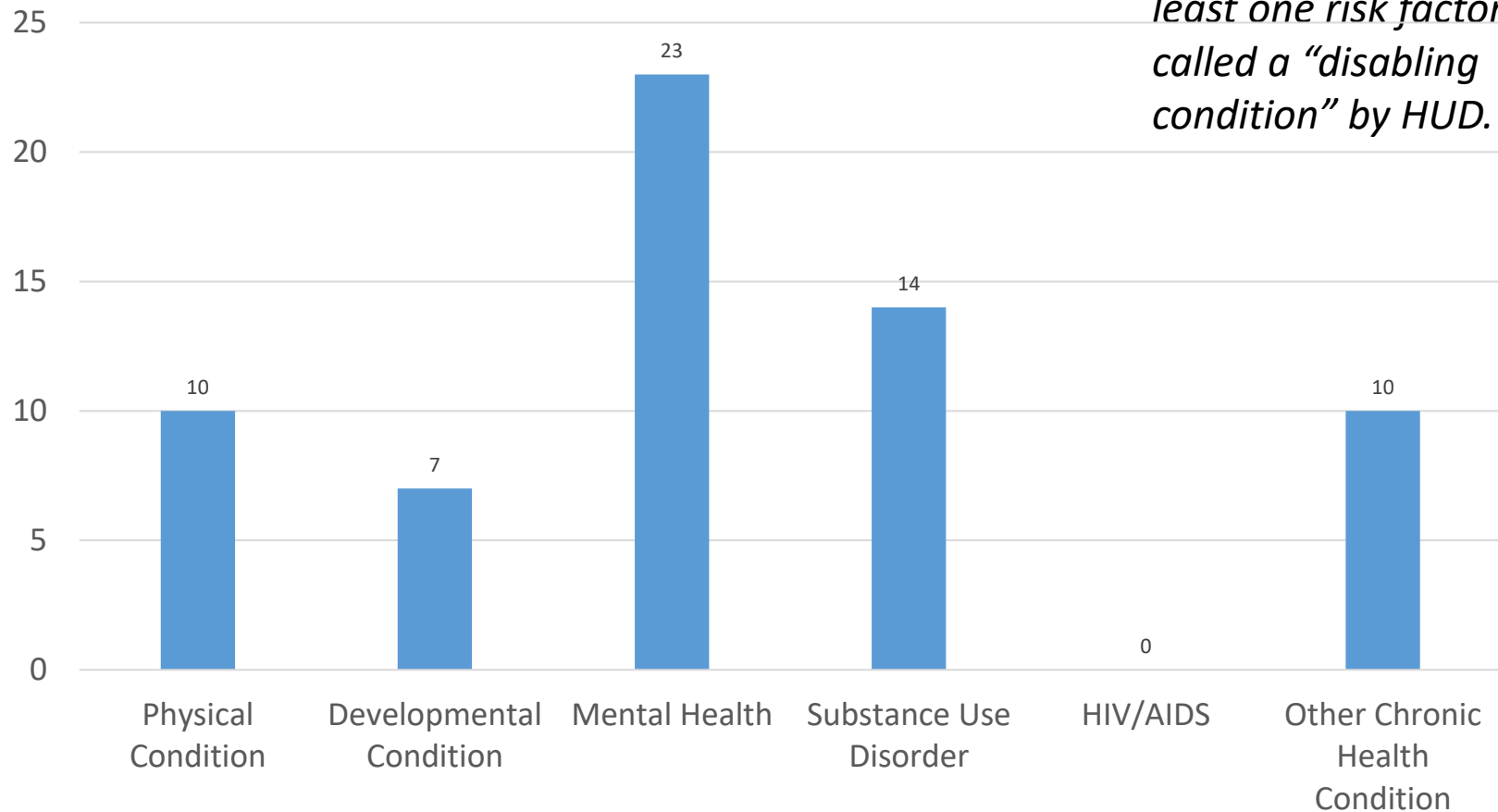
# Currently Fleeing Domestic Violence



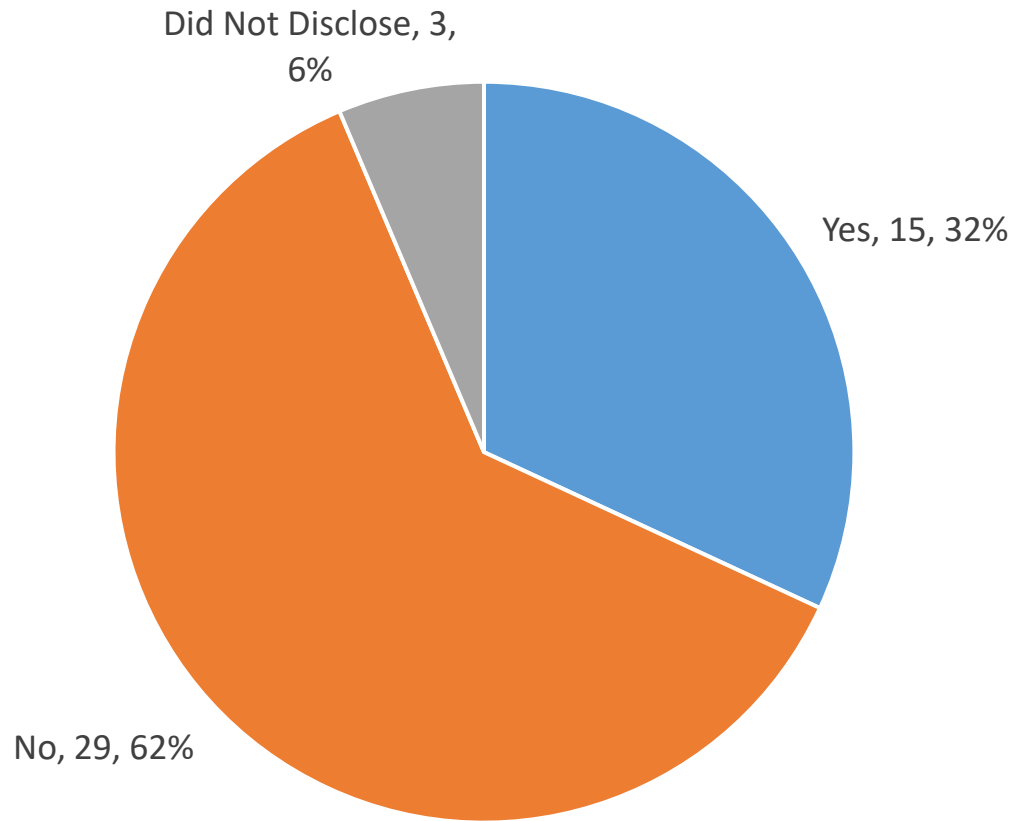
# Risk Factors

*Participants could identify more than one risk factor.*

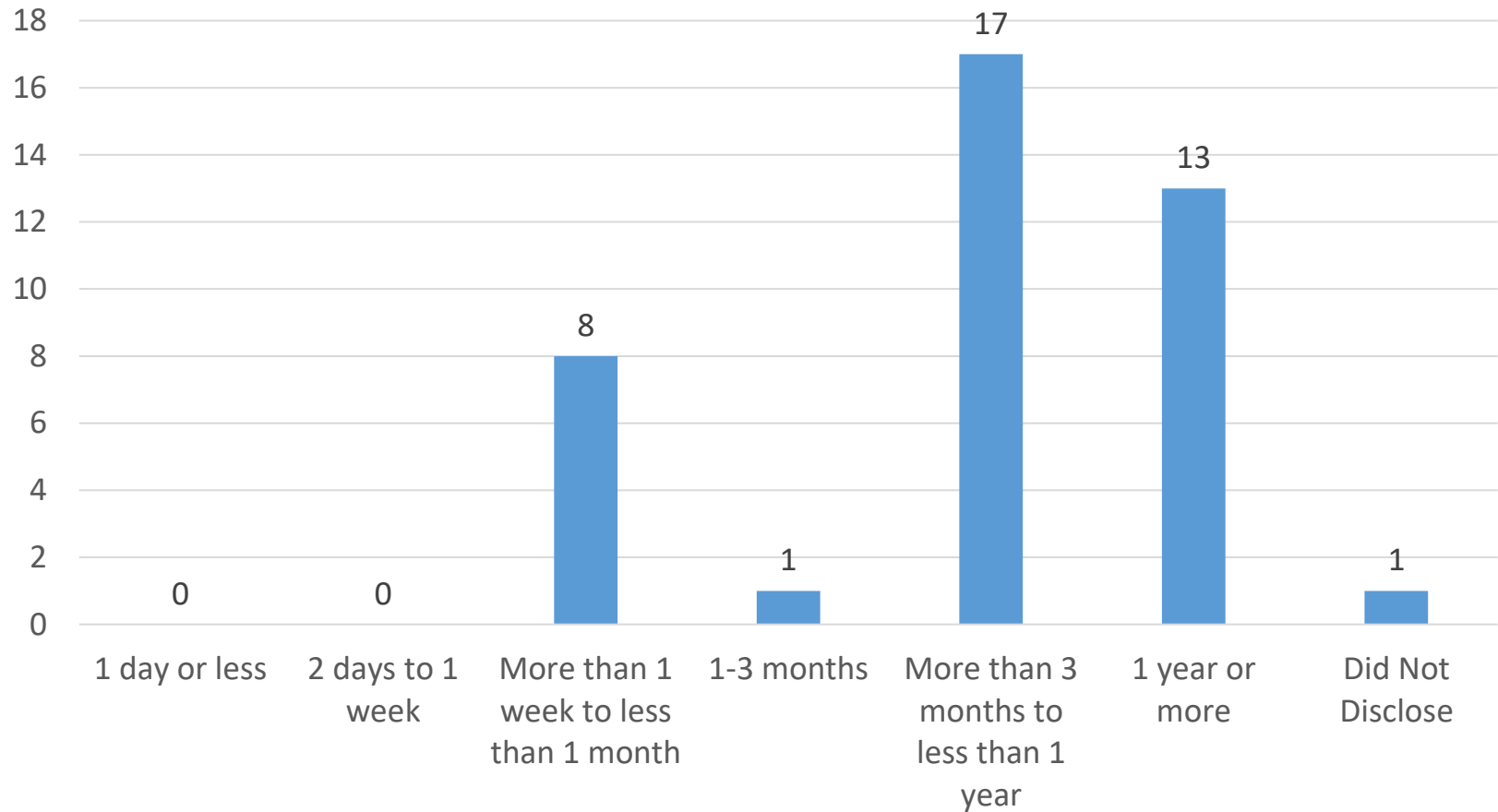
*51% reported having at least one risk factor (also called a “disabling condition” by HUD).*



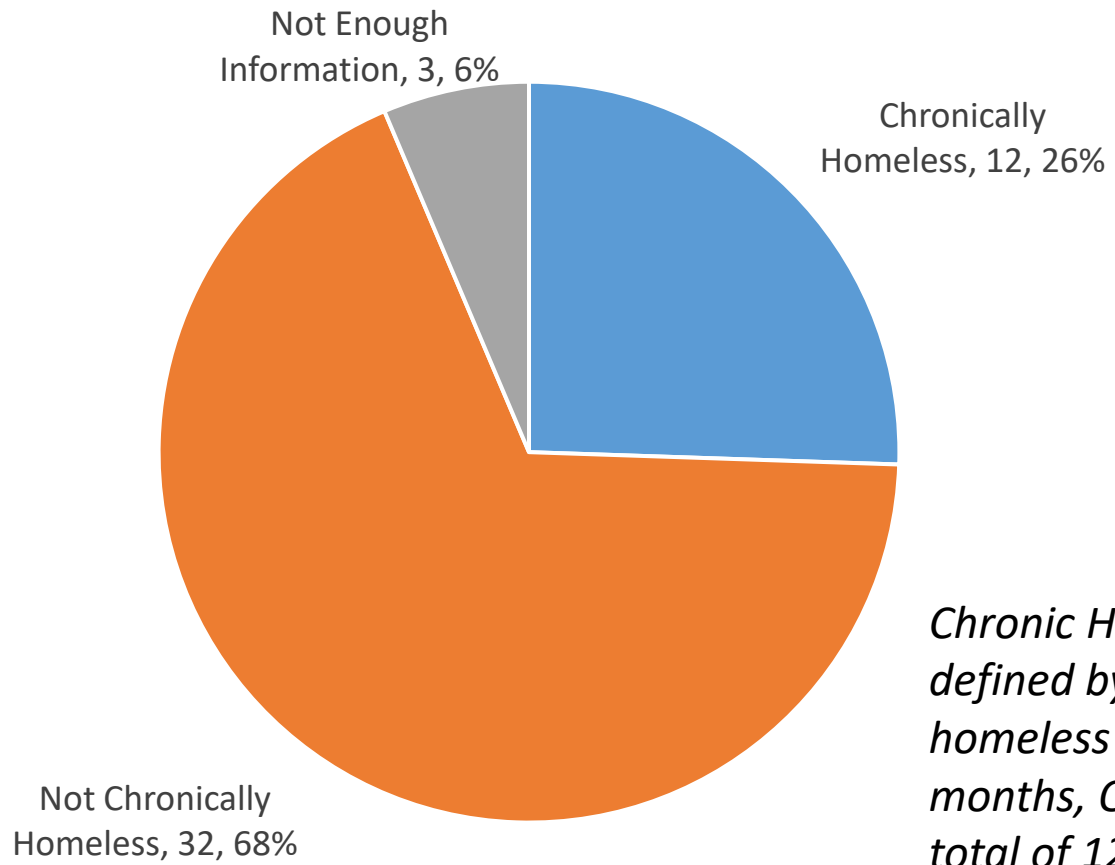
# First Time Homeless?

# Chronic Homelessness

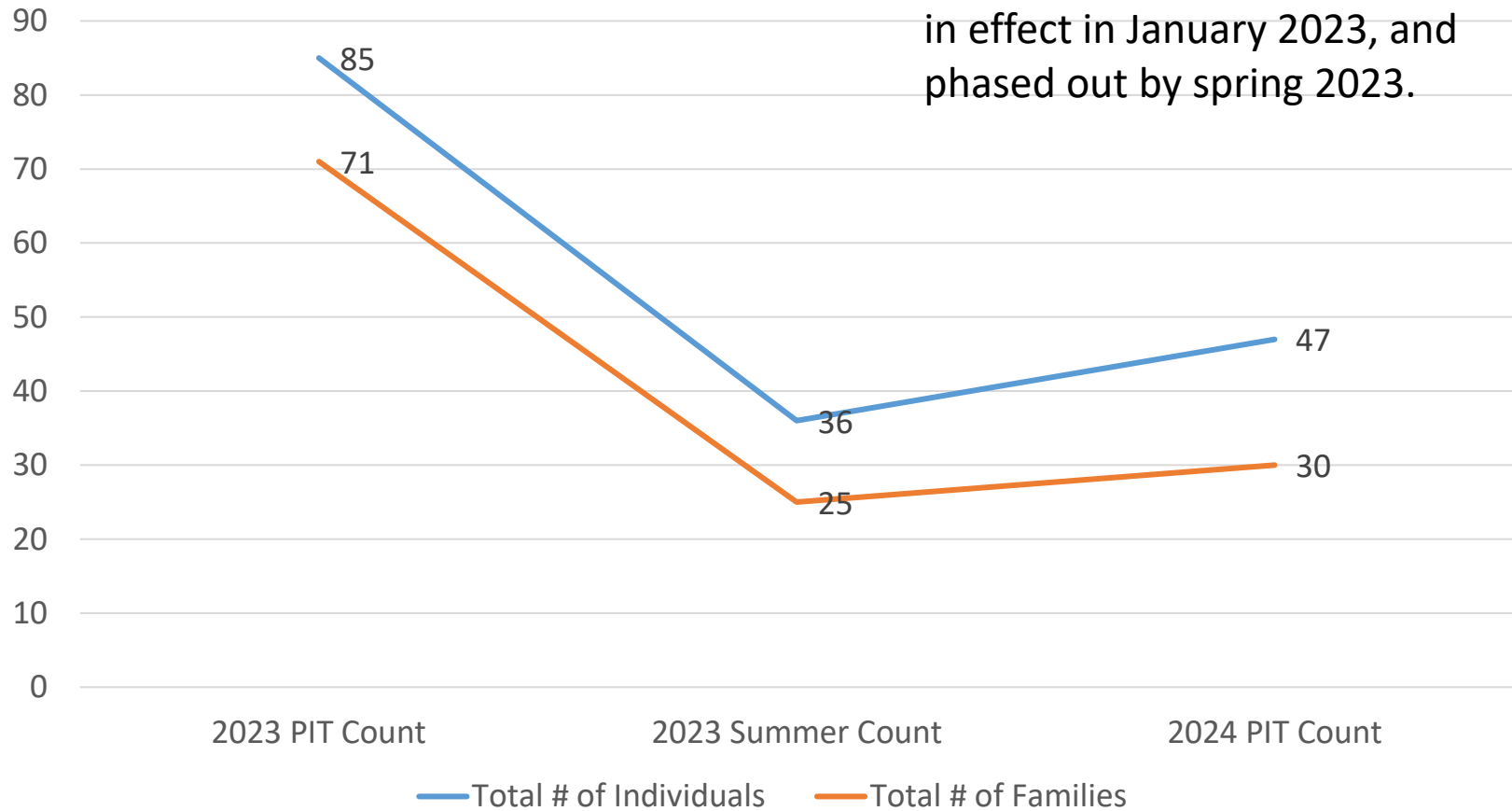


*Chronic Homelessness is defined by HUD as being homeless for the past 12 months, OR a combined total of 12 months of homelessness over the past 3 years.*

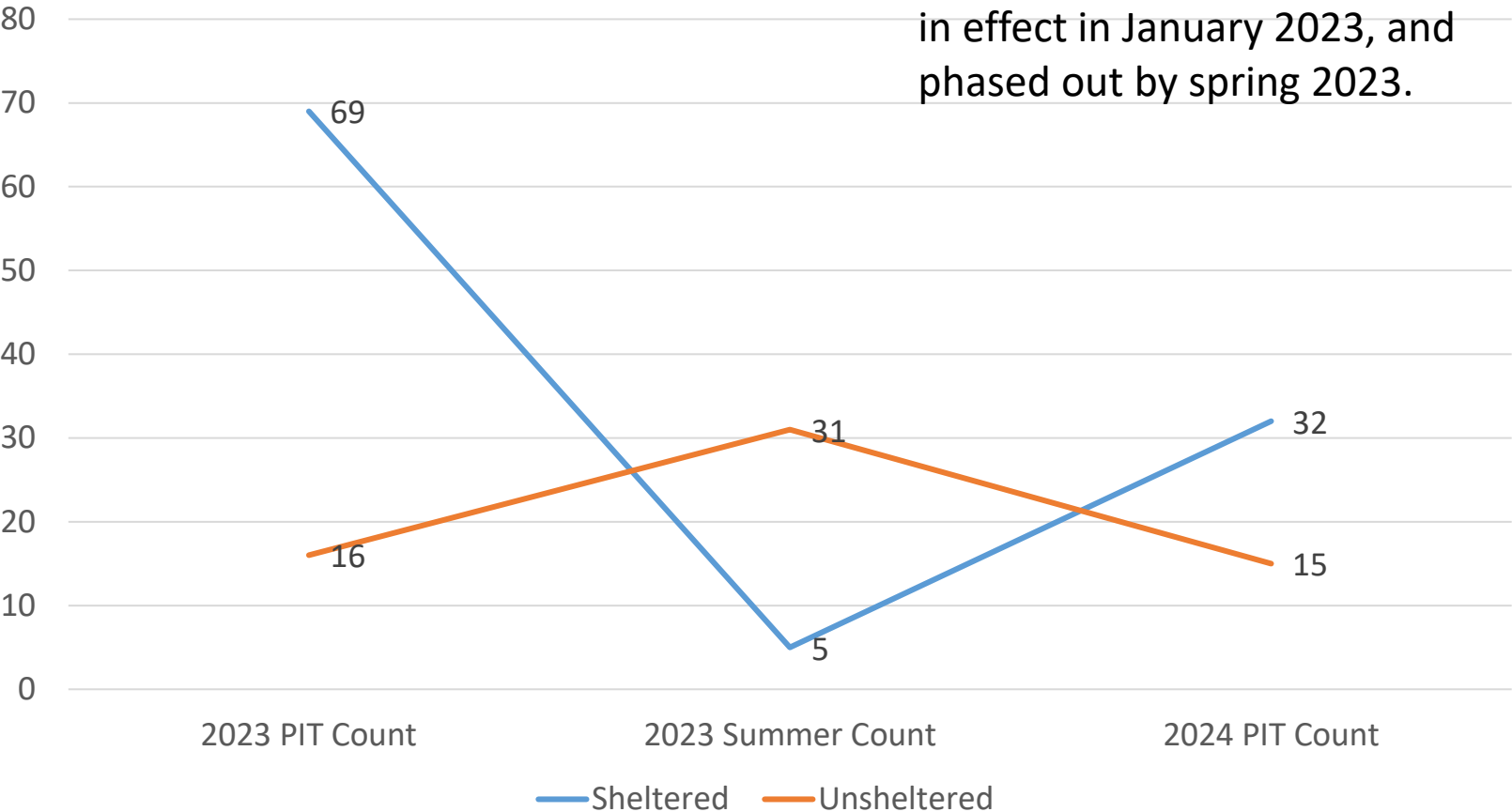

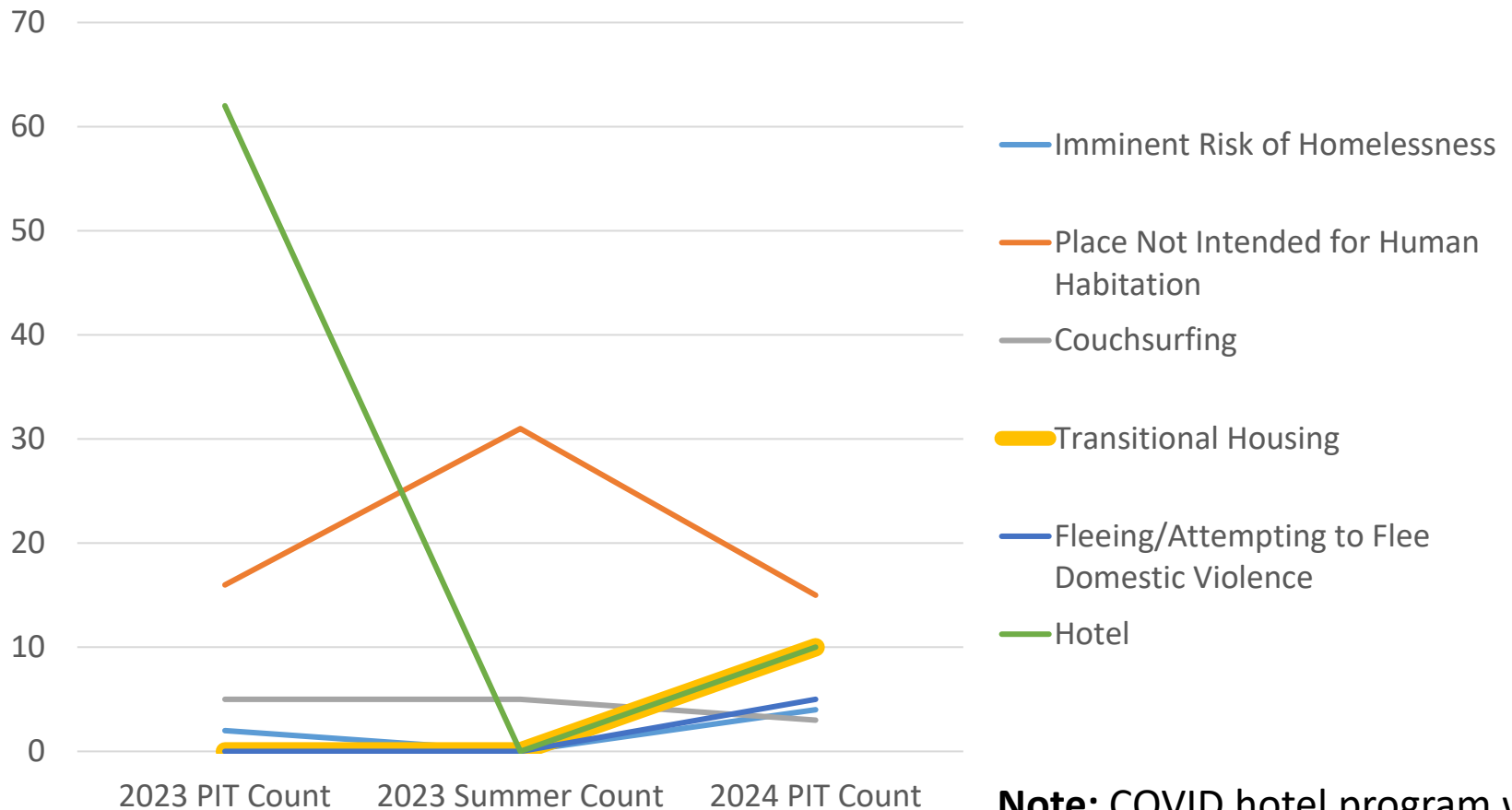
# Sheltered vs. Unsheltered
